### 2. Entrepreneurship skills

- Training students for Mock Trading: It was an activity organized under the college umbrella event NIVESH with an intention to provide deeper insight to our students about the functioning of the stock markets. The focus was on creating an application based learning on real data pertaining to the stock markets. It aimed at providing detailed information to students with respect to stock market analyzing the financial statements of companies and importance of hedging of risk.
- Setting up of incubation cell: Considering Indian Entrepreneurship Spirit and ideas, passion and enthusiasm of Young Indian Entrepreneur's to start businesses on their own, we at MLDCC Incubation and Innovation Cell was started to identify, nurture and groom the business ideas of college students by providing them necessary mentoring, infrastructural and investment support and to encourage entrepreneurship among students through conducting seminars, workshops and competitions.
- Book Share India: Book Share India, a social start-up which uses modern technology and innovation to facilitate book donation and sharing. Book Share India was started in the month of March and till date it has received 6300+ donated books. These books were distributed across India to 37 NGO's. Further they have established 5 mini libraries, renovated 1 existing library and conducted many reading sessions to inculcate reading habits.

Book Share India story is covered by 3 leading Marathi newspapers, 1 English newspaper and even by radio channel 100.7 FM Gold. My actors including Vicky Kaushal has supported BSI on social media. - also have strong social media presence with 1500+ likes on Facebook. MLDCC Incubation and Innovation Cell is optimistic for Book Share India and other college entrepreneurial initiatives and will continue to provide best possible services to the incubated startups.
- **Setting up of Finance Club:** The college has set up a Finance Club to enhance the financial literacy of students and create awareness of different financial services through conduct of guest lectures, quiz competitions. Debates and visit to IDSI (India Bulls Towers) for bootcamp on experiential corporate learning.
- Participation in entrepreneurial competition "Wings To Vision: The P.T.V.A. Institute of Management organized a business plan competition. The initial selection round held in November 2017, received a participation of over 55 teams from all P.T.V.A Institutes. P.T.V.A. Institute of Management, M. L. Dahanukar College of Commerce, Sathaye College and Mulund College of Commerce. The selection round comprised questionnaire and panel interview which included Ms. Ruth Fernandes, Senior Media Professional, Times Group. After this stringent round, 27 teams qualified for the semi-finals. These teams were provided with intensive training by their Faculty In-charge and Industry Experts for preparation of their business plans. On 9 and 10 January, 2018, a workshop was organized in order to enlighten the teams with all the aspects of a sound business model. These sessions were conducted by business stalwarts such as Mr. Mohan Tanksale, Mr. Ajit Deshmukh, Mr. Deepak Ghaisas, CA Mr. Mukund Chitale, Mr. Ajit Marathe, Mr.Shanshank Lanjekar and Mr. Nishad Ramchandran. The knowledge imparted in these sessions led to tremendous improvement in participants' business plan.
